Forklift License Tukwila - In North America, obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators can acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements need to be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machine that is designed with various alternatives, like for instance stand-up and sit down models, propane and electric versions, and different sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of workers. Operator training programs are usually individualized in order to deal with the certain types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck inside a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered forklift in a shipyard. The different lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and businesses. Regulatory standards, hence, tend not to concentrate on detailed course requirements but instead on the results of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common method for operators to acquire their forklift certification or license. This method of certification requires the employer to provide classroom sessions and practical training on equipment within the workplace. Employers may opt to train workers on every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The program incorporates lift truck operation procedures, company policies, lift truck maintenance and safety measures. Subject matters particular to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, must be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize every type of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that employer-provided certifications do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a lift truck license through employer-provided training allows the operator to operate a lift truck for that employer only.

Forklift safety will always be an essential aspect of the lift truck license training, although the specifics of the safety training would be dependent upon the equipment being utilized. Some safety problems will differ for each employer and industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like for example in offshore and marine operations.
